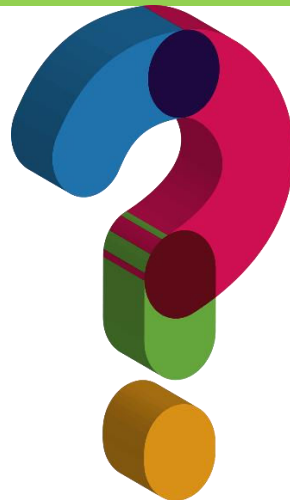

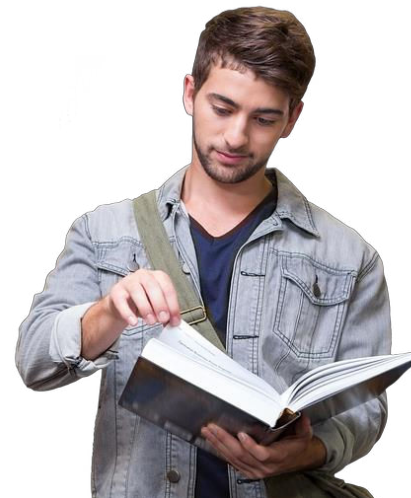
3. What does it do?

TOK is held in English at Kartal Anatolian Imam Hatip High School.

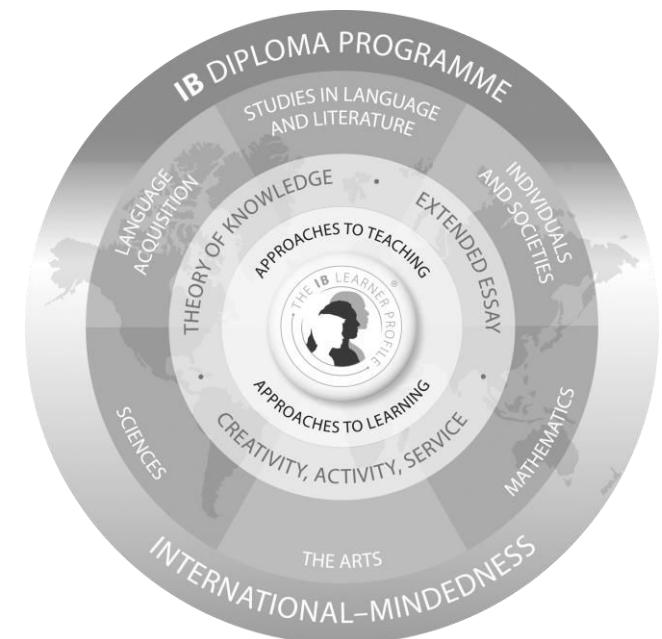
